Build a New Club



How to get started

One of the greatest services Kiwanis members can provide is to help open a new club. Your club already provides much-needed resources to the local community. Imagine expanding your club's—and Kiwanis'—positive influence even more.

Kiwanis International offers a number of resources to make opening a new club simple.

- Start with the Quick-start guide, an outline of the seven steps to opening a new club and a two-month planning calendar.

- Follow the seven steps to opening a club in detail.

7 steps to opening a new club

Opening a new club can be as easy as following these seven steps. Staying focused on why you joined Kiwanis will make the new-club-building steps fun, rewarding and productive.

- **Form a new-club team.**

Request a new-club-building kit, connect with support team members and learn about sponsorship expectations.

- **Evaluate opportunities.**

Conduct a site survey and community analysis, making the case for a new club.

- **Connect to the community.**

Based on your prospect list and community needs, determine the type of club appropriate for your area and what structure your potential members might enjoy.

- **Invite members.**

Use recruiting tips and marketing resources to turn your prospect list into a charter member roster.

- **Get organized.**

Complete the chartering paperwork and plan your organizational meetings using sample meeting agendas.

- **Educate and train officers.**

Conduct new-member orientation, download leadership resources and order officer training materials.

- **Support and mentor.**

Learn how a club counselor can guide a club through the first year and find ready-made fundraisers and service projects that can get your club moving in the right direction.

District Service

The main part of Service is of course done within the framework of the Divisions and the individual Clubs. The major part of this service goes to children, youngsters and their families in their local societies included those who are mentally or physically disabled.

To some extent clubs also supports elderly people in nursing homes and in their homes occasionally. Several clubs also, individually, supports projects in different countries in Europe, Asia and Africa.

District Norden has, for the time being the following Joint Projects, supported by a majority of Clubs:

- The Kiwanis Doll; probably well known throughout the Kiwanis world
- Burn Camp; yearly. This is a Summer Camp for burn survivors; for children. District Norden is the main sponsor for those camps since 2001.
- sponsoring yearly Summer Camps for young people with mental health problems, in co-operation with an organization named "Mental Helse Ungdom"
- Support to Kiwanis Albanian Aid working in the Shkoder area of North Albania, through The Door Albania

The District is also working for a joint project - so far called The Kiwanis Model (Kiwanismodellen) aimed at joining the powers of all forces in the local society supporting children in families with different problems, to secure children's education and their

possibilities to develop to the fullest and to participate fully in a "normal" family, cultural and social life - and for the full development of the personality. (Ref: Convention on the Rights of the Child).

The district will be giving administrative and coordinating support to different projects in each club.

District Norden of course supports the ELIMINATE project and the coordinating organization is established and working.

We are also very proud of that there is organized (last spring) a CKI-club within our area, on the initiative of, and mainly sponsored by, the Kiwanis Club of Trondheim - the CKI NTNU Trondheim (NTNU - Norwegian University of Science and Technology). As far as we can see this is the only/the first CKI-club in whole Europe. The club had 23 members

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Lustrum celebration Kiwanis District Netherlands a success

Saturday the 24th of September, almost 200 Kiwanians celebrated the 5th lustrum of Kiwanis District Netherlands in Barneveld. A part of the celebration was the announcing of the amount of raised funds for the lustrum project, children's hospice De Glind. The total amount raised by Kiwanis clubs in The Netherlands was **€ 250.000**, which will be spent on the realization of a new building and facilities for the children's hospice. Committee leader Gert van Lieshout announced to stay committed to the cause until the opening of the new building in the fall of 2013.

Who pronounced this famous maxim ? Some people would say Maimonide, while others think it was Confucius, in a slightly different version: "**When a man is hungry, it is better to teach him to fish than to give him a fish**". Be has it may, these two wise men agreed on one thing: the importance of teaching and education .

The United Nations Organization adopted the following eight Goals for the Millennium:

1. Eradicate Extreme Hunger and Poverty
2. Achieve Universal Primary Education
3. Promote Gender Equality and Empower Women
4. Reduce Child Mortality
5. Improve Maternal Health
6. Combat HIV/AIDS, Malaria and other disease
7. Ensure Environmental Sustainability
8. Develop a Global Partnership for Development

These should be met by 2015.

There is no other way to ensure a lasting achievement of these 8 goals than by providing children good instruction from their youngest age.

Give a Man a Fish and you feed for a day

Teach a Man to Fish and you feed him for a lifetime

Indeed, education will allow them to earn their living in dignity and to escape spiralling poverty (Goal 1). Girls shall enjoy the same rights, thereby reaching a level of education which will enable them to set up their own activity and give them access to the micro credit system. This will guarantee them equality of treatment and greater autonomy (Goal 3). While in school children will also be given, from their youngest age, advices about hygiene, and be taught how to protect the environment and, later, how to adopt social behavior which will help them to fend off certain diseases (Goals 4,6 and 7).

It is a matter of urgency.

Belgium shares a long history with the Democratic Republic of Congo; that's why we took a particular interest in that country.

In Kinshasa, the capital of the Democratic Republic of Congo, an estimated 25,000 children are living on the streets. Their life is characterized by a total lack of hygiene, a high rate of violence and sexual promiscuity. Drug consumption is standard among them and chronic, infectious and sexually transmissible diseases are very frequent.



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Why did they reach such dire straits ?

- Many come from families in great difficulty, unable to feed their children. Pushed by the hunger, these then turn to the streets for something to eat, they spend their days there and settle down by convenience.
- When the families are too poor and the poverty becomes unbearable, a scapegoat seems to be necessary for the adults to ease their aggressiveness. There is one at hand : the little child. More and more frequently, we hear about "**sorcerer-children**", a charge often leveled against them by their own parents who use this as an excuse to exclude one of their children of the family and throw him onto the street.
- Finally, there are the lone mothers, single or widowed, who can't meet either their own needs or those of their children and urge these to manage it alone, even going as far as abandoning them in despair.

This situation moved Josy Glatigny, a member of the Kiwanis Club of Durbuy in Belgium, to initiate the Kiwanis School Kinshasa project, the aim of which is to finance a complete cycle of primary education for 100 children of Kinshasa in the school situated in the village build by "SOS Children Villages" in this city.

The project outgrew KC Durbuy and a committee was founded comprised of Kiwanians coming from various quarters of the Belgium-Luxemburg district.

Our initiative, which enjoys the support of the Kiwanis International Foundation in Indianapolis, is of a preventive nature. Other associations are trying to bring a help on the ground to the children on the streets. Our purpose is to avoid that other children go and join the ranks of those. Besides its teaching role, the NGO "SOS Children Villages" also develops a family-reinforcement program offering these material an moral help geared to prevent child reject and abandonment.

The first school year financed by this initiative will start on the 5th September 2011. It is a first step and a contribution towards the achievement of the Goals of the Millennium.


